Date	Subject	Definition
January	No Competition	
February 12	<b>Negative Space</b>	An image where the subject(s) is accompanied by a dominant, mostly featureless space that enhances the viewing experience by drawing the viewer to the subject(s).
March 11	<b>ICM</b>	Moving the camera during exposure to show movement in the image.
April 8	<b>Summer</b>	No definition – open to interpretation ***
May 13	<b>Framed</b>	An image where the subject is framed or contained within an object or objects at the time of photographing the subject and not added later. An example is a view looking through a window.
June 10	<b>Interclub Subject: Action</b>	This can include animate or inanimate objects involved in any form of action. It is not limited to human activity. The possibilities are infinite but as long as the main thrust of the image implies action then it will be acceptable under the definition.
July 8	<b>Close Up / Macro</b>	To be taken close to the subject to show detail, macro gets even closer.
August 12	<b>Tewantin Shield Subject: Low Key</b>	A low-key image is one that contains predominantly dark tones and colours. Like high-key images, low-key photography conveys atmosphere and mood. But where a high-key image feels airy and light, a low-key is usually dramatic and full of mystery. And where high-key lighting over-lights the subject to reduce contrast, low-key lighting creates striking contrasts through reduced lighting. Shadows are now the primary element of the composition.
September 9	<b>Leading Lines</b>	Lines or implied lines that lead the viewers eye through the image.
October 14	<b>Life in the City</b>	No definition – open to interpretation ***
November 11	<b>Change</b>	Various interpretations of change including – changing seasons, stages of life, nature creates change, change of perspective.
